TRAFFIC AND SAFETY COMMITTEE

The Traffic and Safety Committee has been working closely with Mr. Conner in the Department of Transportation. Unfortunately the city denied our request for a traffic signal at Franklin and Whitley on the grounds that there is not enough automotive and foot traffic from Whitley Avenue. They cid, however satisfy several of our other requests.

First of all, "Tow Away-No Stopping Any Time" restrictions have been authorized for Franklin Avenue a) on the north side extending 50 feet easterly and 86 feet westerly from the curbs of Whitley Avenue and b) on the south side extending 100 feet easterly and 46 feet westerly. These same tow away restrictions have also been authorized for the Grace Avenue area a) on the north side of Franklin Avenue beginning at the east curb of Grace Avenue and extending 80 feet easterly and b) on the east side of Grace Avenue beginning 460 feet south of Whitley Terrace intersection and extending 485 feet south to Franklin Avenue. We're delighted because these actions will provide better visibility at these intersections for both foot and auto traffic.

Also in response to our request, the city adjusted the signal on Milner and Highland that many of us were sitting impatiently at for long periods of time.

Some proposals which will require further action including review and concurrence by residents are: 1) the possibility of one-way streets in certain areas, 2) further restriction in parking on some of the narrower street sections, and 3) change in street name for the short section of Las Palmas from Franklin to

RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

You may have noticed construction at several locations on the Hill. On one lot on Highland 57 condominium units were approved. Our Board successfully had the density reduced from 65 units with no exit onto Las Palmas. We were also able to insist on provisions for landscaping with trees. On Grace Ave. 32 units are being built which will exit onto Grace. And construction has begun on Highland for another 81 condominium units.
